

DAGLINGWORTH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

MINUTES

Held on 4th November 2024 at 7.30 pm

In the Village Hall

1.	Welcome and Introductions by the Chair
2.	Attendance: Councillors Graham White, Paul Lane, Jocasta Bullock, Ross Sharpe. Three members of public including webmaster.
3.	Apologies from District Councillor Julia Judd who was attending Cowley Parish Meeting.
4.	There were no Declarations of Interest for matters on the agenda.
5.	Minutes of the Parish Council Annual Meeting held on 9 th September 2024 were approved.
6.	There was no report from Cllr Judd but Chair said he would circulate her monthly report to Parish Councils when received.
7.	<p>Daglingworth Stream above Grove Hill: The Duchy had reported that the leaky dams had been built but a member of the public said that one of them didn't appear to be finished. Chair will contact Duchy for an update. The tree planting was due to be carried out over winter. The Parish Council are awaiting License for signature whereby they will keep a watching brief over the condition of the dams and report any issues to The Duchy. Also License to occupy land under "The King's Library" former phone box.</p> <p>Daglingworth Stream through Millennium Field: Chair said that at present the stream is unobstructed by overgrown vegetation so no clearance required. Situation to be monitored however.</p>
8.	<p>Planning Matters:</p> <p>Bridge Cottage: after successful lobbying from neighbours, CDC has requested further information from the applicant. No information forthcoming as yet.</p> <p>Manor Farm building: Chair said he was awaiting further information from Enforcement Officer District Council if she has heard from property owner. No planning application received. Member of public, an architect, said that listing by way of curtilage was not clear cut.</p>
9.	<p>Highways and Drainage Matters:</p> <p>High Bank cutting now part of Nic's Mowing contract and no complaints over condition received.</p>

	<p>GCC liaising with CDC over surface water drainage at School Lane and Lower End. GCC have been provided with location of silt traps at Itlay for cleaning out. Cllr Sharpe said a resident had removed some of the silt which had accumulated at the bottom of the Dowers Hill for which the Council should be grateful.</p> <p>A resident, whose property is affected by surface water from School Lane is proposing to ask GCC Councillor Harris to take political interest in water run-off from all the roads leading down into the village to establish if design solutions can be found. She will circulate her own Consultant Engineer's report to the other parishioners present at the meeting.</p>
10.	<p>No payments to be recorded.</p> <p>Account balance £23,113.80</p> <p>Cllr Sharpe making arrangements with Barclays to add name to mandate</p>
11.	<p>Speedwatch: training completed. Cllr Lane reported on results from survey which showed some speeding vehicles. Radar Gun to be purchased with counter. Total cost £131.33 which the council approved. Cllr Lane will order.</p>
12.	<p>Cllr Bullock to be sent details of Parish Clerk's email address. She is also attending trip to GCC's rubbish incinerator and will report at next meeting</p>
13.	<p>The Council considered proposals for the precept for year 2025/26 and agreed an increase to be kept as low as possible bearing in mind inflation. They agreed 3%.</p>
